Subject: **Bad Creek Pumped Storage Project (P-2740-053)
Filing of Draft License Application**

Dear Secretary Reese:

Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (Duke Energy or Licensee) is the Licensee, owner, and operator of the 1,400-megawatt (MW) Bad Creek Pumped Storage Project (Project) (FERC Project No. 2740) located in Oconee County, South Carolina, approximately eight miles north of Salem. The Project utilizes the Bad Creek Reservoir as the upper reservoir and Lake Jocassee, which is licensed as part of the Keowee-Toxaway Hydroelectric Project (FERC Project No. 2503), as the lower reservoir.

The existing (original) license for the Project was issued by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC or Commission) for a 50-year term, with an effective date of August 1, 1977, and expires July 31, 2027. Accordingly, Duke Energy is pursuing a new license for the Project pursuant to the Commission's Integrated Licensing Process (ILP), as described at 18 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 5. Duke Energy is proposing additional energy storage and generation capacity at the Project, which would be developed by constructing a new 1,400-MW Bad Creek II Power Complex (Bad Creek II) adjacent to the existing powerhouse.

Pursuant to 18 CFR § 5.16, Duke Energy is hereby filing the Draft License Application (DLA) for the Project for review and comment. As described in the DLA, in the new license term, Duke Energy is proposing to continue operating the Project on a "daily cycle" mode, commonly alternating between generating and pumping on a daily basis, with the reservoir typically maintained in the upper 50 to 60 feet (ft) at elevations of 2,310 and 2,250 ft above mean sea level (compared to a maximum drawdown of 160 ft). Following Bad Creek II construction, the Licensee would continue operating the upper reservoir within the current licensed maximum operating band; however, because of the increased hydraulic capacity with the addition of Bad Creek II, generation run times (at best efficiency) would decrease from approximately 23 hours to approximately 12 hours, and the energy density would increase by a factor of approximately two. This means that twice as many MW-hours could be brought to the grid during times of increased demand.

The DLA includes all studies conducted for the relicensing and reflects the substantive amount of consultation that has occurred throughout the ILP process, including the Bad Creek Relicensing Agreement signed in January 2025 by Duke Energy, resource agencies, and non-governmental organizations. The Bad Creek Relicensing Agreement is a comprehensive settlement agreement reflecting a shared vision for the operation of the Project, including Bad Creek II, during the next license term. Accordingly, the DLA includes preliminary proposals for protection, mitigation, and enhancement (PM&E) measures related to operations and resources associated with the Project and construction of Bad Creek II. The proposed PM&E measures described in the DLA reflect careful consideration of available information, results of studies conducted, issues specific to the Project, and the Bad Creek Relicensing Agreement. Duke Energy notes these proposals are preliminary and may be refined in the Final License Application.
